Summer Reading


Like summer movies, summer reading seems to have become a genre all to itself. While movie theaters serve up a selection of animated adventures and comic strip superheroes, we serve ourselves similarly lighter fare for the hot months when a mystery novel seems just the thing to tuck into the vacation bound luggage or to haul off to some shady veranda. Our featured book this month is perhaps a cut above the usual detective serials for the literary style of its Irish author Tana French who won the Edgar, Anthony, Macavity and Barry awards for this first novel.



In the Woods by Tana French A twenty year old memory haunts our narrator, detective Rob Ryan--or rather, the lack of a memory. Twenty years ago, Rob was the only survivor of a horrific unsolved crime -- the disappearance of three schoolchildren in a small Irish town. Only Rob ever reappeared --blood-soaked and unable to recall anything about what had happened to him and his playmates. And now, in the very woods where the decades old vanishing took place, a new murder has occurred --the body of a local girl, Katy Devlin, is found by a group of university students helping an archeological dig, and Rob is heading the investigation.

Assisting Rob is his friend and squad partner, Cassie Maddox. They make a pair intimate in every way but the physical. Cassie, too, has a past she is still coping with: a strategic retreat from college where she became involved with a manipulative, psychopathic schoolmate.

The case has them following many threads --Why? ever leading them toward Who? Was the murder to do with with Katy's imminent departure for a premier ballet school, or with her father's activist protests





against the new highway development project being delayed by the archeological dig. Or, is there some truth to the rumors of sexual abuse in the family-- or is it a killer from long ago reappearing for yet another ritual murder over an ancient altar?

As Rob and Cassie follow the threads into a veritable spider's web, past and present tangle around them and the conclusion defies the easy conventions of the detective genre for a read that's chilling enough to forego air-conditioning.
