Streets of Laredo is the last book in the Lonesome Dove series, which begins with Dead Man's Walk about the experiences of two young Texas Rangers, Woodrow Call and Gus Macrae. The second book in the series, Comanche Moon, explores Call and Macrae in their middle years and bridges the stories between Dead Man's Walk and the next in the series, Lonesome Dove. Featured This Month

Streets of Laredo written by Larry McMurtry; directed by Joseph Sargent

The miniseries on DVD adaptation of Larry McMurtry's Streets of Laredo is an entertaining and action filled adventure that continues the story of Captain Woodrow Call, Gus Macrae's old partner from Lonesome Dove. James Garner plays Captain Call in his later years, after the failure of his Montana cattle ranch and death of his son, Newt. Captain Call, older and a little slower, is now a bounty hunter hired by a wealthy railroad president to track down a teenaged, cold-blooded killer disrupting his railroad and costing him considerable profits with his deadly train robberies. The robber, Joey Garza, is equipped with a German-made rifle that can shoot a man from a half mile away and enough hatred and bitterness to overshadow any humanity he once may have had.

Call, an accountant for the railroad who is completely unsuited for the Western life, and an inexperienced deputy sheriff set out to stop Joey Garza. Call's corporal and fellow former Texas Ranger, Pea Eye Parker (played by Sam Shepard), who usually



accompanies Call on his bounty hunter duties, reluctantly refuses Call's summons for help but later follows after the group with the celebrated Kickapoo tracker, Famous Shoes (Wes Studi). After hearing that Mox Mox, an evil old villain known for burning his victims alive, is active once again, Pea Eye's wife Lorena (Gus' true love in *Lonesome Dove*, played by Sissy Spacek) closes up the school, sends her five children to safety in Nebraska and sets off to save her Once a captive of Mox Mox and the husband. Indian, Blue Duck, Lorena fears the danger Pea Eye will find on his travels to connect with Call.

The story also centers on the family of Joey Garza, his single mother (Sonia Braga) and two other children who live across the Texas border in Mexico. Other interesting characters from the history of the West, Judge Roy Bean, the "Law West of the Pecos," famous lion hunter, Ben Lilly, and the legendary Texas Gunfighter, John Wesley Hardin, also appear. This story explores the immense capacity for evil of which mankind is capable, as well as the courageous and ordinary men by whose heroism it is defeated.
