Crime that Pays!


Stephen Booth was a newspaper and magazine journalist for over 25 years before his first published novel, *Black Dog*, was named by the *London Evening Standard* as one of the six best crime novels of the year. It also won the Barry Award for Best British Crime Novel and was nominated for an Anthony Award for Best First Mystery. His subsequent Cooper and Fry novels have won the author numerous awards, including another Barry Award for his second novel, *Dancing with the Virgins*, and a Crime Writers' Association "Dagger in the Library" Award for his fourth novel in the series, *Blind to the Bones*.

Cooper & Fry Mystery Series by Stephen Booth

In Black Dog, Booth first introduces readers to the complex relationship between characters, Derbyshire police detectives DC Ben Cooper and DS Diane Fry. Considerate and thoughtful, but uneasy with himself, Detective Constable Cooper is a product of smalltown Edendale in Northern England's Peak District. Striving to follow in his father's footsteps as a respected Derbyshire cop and drawing on his hardworking and earnest farming family's legacy, Ben Cooper's insightful and soft-spoken policing style clashes with that of his new partner and future supervisor, Detective Sergeant Diane Fry, and her ambitions, secrecy and prickly nature. Surviving a difficult childhood and personal tragedy has made DS Fry closed off to both personal relationships and office camaraderie and determined to rise in the police hierarchy. Finding herself in the slow pace of small-town life has Diane Fry chafing against everything and everyone in her new posting, especially DC Ben Cooper.

Stephen Booth has written 12 novels in this mystery series. While exploring the partnership and

relationship between two very interesting, complicated and likable detectives, the author delves into an assortment of crimes which involve motives such as horrid working conditions of immigrant workers, misunderstandings and suspicion between neighbors, the consequences and tragedies of mental illness, family dynamics and betrayal. The characters in Booth's novels evolve and plots remain fresh from one book to the next, and the author paints the settings in such a way that the reader is drawn into the landscapes of the Peak District itself.

The Library currently has several books in this series, including *Black Dog* (#1), *Blind to the Bones* (#4), *One Last Breath* (#5), *The Dead Place* (#6), *Scared to Live* (#7) *and Lost River* (#10).
