
### A Time and a Place

Two recent books of Texas popular history by E. R. Bills are the subjects of this month's review. The reviewer happens to be the uncle of the author but wishes to assure all readers that there's no bias in this review.

### **Featured This Month**

Texas Obscurities: Stories of the Peculiar, Exceptional & Nefarious by E.R. Bills contains 24 chapters, each describing a remarkable and little known facet of Texas history. For example, two stories detail the brief tenure in 1918 of the first female sheriff in the U.S. and in 1925 of the nation's first all-female state Supreme Court. Others document exceptionally destructive natural phenomena such as an overnight "heat burst" in north Texas and an earthquake in far west Texas. There are descriptions of the many UFO sightings of 1897 (rivaling Roswell) and of 1969 encounters with a Bigfoot monster. Of World War II research on using bats to deliver bombs and of the arrival of Japanese balloon bombs. Of a priest who really did get tarred and feathered. Of the 30-year fight over the estate of a wealthy eccentric with no clear heirs. Of events in the state involving Charles Lindbergh and Thomas Edison. And other historical tidbits.

Two of the more horrifying stories in that book deal with the massacre of practically an entire Hispanic town in West Texas by Texas Rangers and the slaughter of African-Americans by whites in the eastern part of the state. Bills was so disturbed by the latter case that he expanded his investigation to produce the second book, The 1910 Slocum Massacre: An Act of Genocide in East Texas (2014). In this book, he documents what may have been the largest mob killing of blacks by whites in U. S. history. The author grounds the event in the



racist legacy of the Civil War in Texas, a legacy that I myself experienced first-hand still thirty years later growing up in Fort Worth. He amplifies the horrors by describing in detail other atrocities such as the lynchings of African-Americans by other Anglo mobs. It is equally horrifying to read of the author's difficulty in trying to uncover the facts of the case because of the desire to distort and obscure the event from the very beginning and a century-long unwillingness to acknowledge the massacre.

The second book is a difficult read not only because of the subject but also because the facts of the story are elusive and confounded by covert and overt deception. Nevertheless, both books are written with a clear and engaging style, and both are documented with photos, notes, and references and have comprehensive indices.
