# **Featured This Month**


#### LIT – A Memoir by Mary Karr

This is a story about a drunk, from a family of drunks. If you read any of Karr's previous books -- **The Liars Club** or **Cherry** you may have always known there was room for "the rest of the story". **LIT** does that – and it pulls you in to be shocked, to laugh, and invites you into Karr's growing up, adult world of alcoholism, motherhood, marriage, and getting sober.

Karr is a memoirist – and a good one. Her use of memories and detail reveal her intimate secrets and at the same time, alcoholism has erased enough that forgetting has become a part of her story.

After she runs away from her Texas childhood – a drunken father who was a charmer and her drunken mother who was suicidal, life seems better. After a brief stint of drugs and drinking in California, Karr enrolls in a small Minnesota college at age 17. It is there she began to write, poetry, prose and as she said "the myth that if I could shuffle words in the right order, I could get my story straight."

When studying for her master's in Vermont, she meets Warren – someone from a world very different than hers who shared her love of language. He has a claim to aristocracy, which he is trying to escape, and she continues to try and escape the family lineage of alcoholism. She works to keep her drinking under control during youth and her pregnancy but the chaos



of marriage, motherhood, and work make it impossible.

It's a familiar story –promises to quit, "I'll just have one," the pressures which are used as excuses for drinking, sneaking around trying to remember where she hid the bottle, hiding the empty bottles from her husband, starting fights, accidents – finally heading to therapy.

Her marriage dissolves under the pressures – and it is then that Karr begins to write the Memoir that will become **The Liars Club** and then **Cherry**. This book, **LIT**, tells us all that was left out of those books. And even though forgetting is part of the memory, it is astonishing, it is funny, and it is serious. She grows up.
