


HILLSBORO COMMUNITY LIBRARY NEWS


Featured this Month



Shake My Sillies Out
By Raffi (Author) and David Allender (Illustrator)

This book is an illustrated, story form of the popular song by Egyptian-born Canadian singer-songwriter, author and children's entertainer Raffi Cavoukian, better known simply as Raffi. The story (song) is set on a moonlit night at a children's camp named Camp Mariposa. A bear, a rabbit and a squirrel can't get to sleep and are keeping the other animals up. Pretty soon campers, camp leaders, police, firemen and other animals are swept up in the urge to shake, clap, jump and wiggle – and finally yawn. Words and music to the song are included at the end of the book.

The library collection also includes *Down by the Bay*, another Raffi Songs to Read book.



I'm Big Enough

By Amber Stewart (Author) and Layn Marlow (Illustrator)

This is a beautifully illustrated, very sweet and heartwarming story of the changes that happen in childhood. Bean is a very grown-up little bunny rabbit who can do anything, but she can't quite stop carrying her favorite blanket everywhere she goes. When her parents and big brother try to encourage her to stop taking it everywhere, Bean comes up with a plan to hide the blanket so it will always be safe. The only problem is when Bean decides she can't sleep without it, she can't remember which hollow log she hid the blanket in. In a story of growing up, Bean discovers she really is big enough.
