
### Featured this Month

Albert of Adelaide by Howard Anderson

This novel relates the adventures of an orphaned, runaway-from-the-Adelaide-Zoo platypus. He leaves the zoo in search of the river that was his home and to escape the ever-peering eyes, jeers, and monotonous routine that had become his life.

He has heard from the other animals in the zoo that "Old Australia" exists and that is where he will find his former home on the banks of the Murray River. He nearly dies in a sand storm but is rescued by Jack the wombat. And as it is in most fantasies, they become friends and share clothing, food and drink.

The cast of characters, friend and foe, that Albert encounters in his search allows a fanciful look at what the Australia Outback might be. In this tale, marsupials believe they are the chosen ones and the kangaroo is at the top of this hierarchy. There are drunken bandicoots, villainous wallabies, a murderous opossum, a famous retired Tasmanian devil wrestler, mysterious dingo packs, and a raccoon that hopped a ship in San Francisco to escape a mob of what might be the KKK.





Albert, through no fault of his own (other than being a platypus) becomes a feared and Wanted-Dead-or-Alive character in some circles and a revered and honored character by others.

His adventure is action packed yet full of sentimentality. In my humble opinion, it is a quick and enjoyable read.
