The Swamp and the Marsh


Although "swamp" has a political definition that is often applied to an urban setting, this term and the word "marsh" are mostly used synonymously to describe a wetlands. The author of this month's featured book draws a distinction: "Marsh is not swamp. Marsh is a space of light, where grass grows in water, and water flows into the sky....Then within the marsh, here and there, true swamp crawls into low-lying bogs, hidden in clammy forests. Swamp water is still and dark, having swallowed the light in its muddy throat."

Where the Crawdads Sing by Delia Owens

Kya Clark at seven years old, the youngest of the children in her family, watches from the doorway of their shack on the North Carolina coast as her mother walks away humming to herself and swinging a dilapidated suitcase. It's not even the first abandonment. Her father is regularly absent, her oldest siblings are gone, and very soon her best-loved big brother leaves home too. At ten, she's on her own.

For a time her infrequent father shows up with some life-lessons, chief among them, to use her keen observation and pragmatic judgment to make her way in her small but vital natural world. She is sporadically supported materially by the charitable impulses of a black family whose patriarch, Jumpin' runs a general store. And after running away from school and social services, she is tutored in reading and general academics by a sympathetic older boy, Tate Walker. In time, Kya survives to become the "Marsh Girl," a mysterious person looked upon with disgust and suspicion by the townspeople, but a young woman of insight, independence, and spirit.





No doubt that is what eventually attracts the older Tate, who is torn between his ambitions to become a research scientist and his desire for a life beside his fisherman father and this seemingly wild, natural girl in the beauty of the marsh. But such an exotic creature also attracts predators. The former football hero and son of the town's big shot businessman, Chase Andrews, also desires her, and as Tate's plans take him away from the marsh, Kya turns to a man who can legitimize her in a way she has never dreamed of.

But when Chase is found dead beneath a fire tower in the dark reaches of the swamp, this coming-of-age story becomes a murder mystery headed toward a gripping courtroom denouement.

Throughout the book, clues to Kya's mind and the events that hold her fate are scattered in her observations of the wild creatures she communes with and the natural laws of the environment that has become her mother and her teacher. In the end, the answer has been there in front of us all along.
