


Law and Order, Ltd: The Rousing Life of Elfego Baca by Kyle S. Crichton

This informal biography of Elfego Baca consists mostly of stories of incidents in his life that characterize his lifestyle, some of them obtained from Elfego and some from other sources. The book, written by an author who knew Elfego and with his cooperation was published in 1928 while Elfego was still alive.

Elfego was born in Socorro, New Mexico, but spent most of his youth in Kansas when his parents moved there to improve their sons' education. After Elfego's mother died he returned to Socorro with his brother and his father became the Town Marshal of Belen. A dispute of his father with a powerful local politician resulted in his father being imprisoned in Belen. His rescue by fifteen year old Elfego and a friend was by subterfuge and doing the unexpected, not by violence.

The next incident presented was quite the opposite. The gun-fight at 'Frisco lasted about a day and a half with Elfego pitted against a mob of 80 irate armed cowboys who objected to his arrest of one of their number for shooting up the town and endangering the local inhabitants. Elfego emerged from the battle





uninjured despite thousands of shots by the cowboys into his totally inadequate shelter while there were four of the cowboys dead from his few well placed shots to defend himself against their approach to his hiding place.

One of my favorite stories took place while Elfego was County Sheriff in which he used finesse rather than force to accomplish the arrest of numerous accused criminals. His reputation as a gunfighter was such by that point that when he wrote to the accused persons pointing out the danger to them if he had to come find them, they simply came in and surrendered.

Lawyer, politician, representative of the Mexican government, newspaper publisher, security guard, Rio Grande conservationist, and judge are among the various roles he played in the stories recounted in this book. He was tried for murder several times, both as a lawman and in defending himself against efforts to eliminate him. In all of these roles he maintained his characteristics of facing the problem at hand promptly and using whatever means necessary to solve it, be it a gun, finesse, or persuasion.
