
Featured this Month

Unsung Heroes: A Second Chance at Life by Joe Ficklin

Local long-time Hillsboro-area resident, Joe Ficklin was having an ordinary day at a dangerous job in his specialization of aerial mapping, or photogrammetry, and surveying when his life changed suddenly in an unimaginable way. Highly experienced, Joe had made multiple trips in a helicopter before this contract to survey ground control for 28 miles of aerial mapping in Gunnison County, Colorado. This time Joe was flying in a helicopter over the rugged San Juan Mountains of Southwest Colorado when the physics of capabilities of a Cessna Skyhook, maximum load and the ability to gain altitude changed his life forever.

This is a book about Joe and his fellow surveyors' desperate struggle to survive and the men who rescued them. Joe's story communicates the pain and suffering of those who survived the December 30, 1961, crash and the heroism of the men who came to rescue them in those frigid mid-winter days at almost 8,500 feet elevation. Before the days of elite, well-trained mountain rescue teams, the men who volunteered were ordinary men, everyday heroes who put aside their personal lives to save other human beings who would die if not reached quickly.

In Joe's book, he shares with the reader his will to survive and the unwavering support of his new wife, Sandy, in his long, agonizing and painful path to recovery. He also shares his mental journey to returning to a meaningful, worthwhile life--how





hitting a ball off a tee with a golf club, cradling the club in his bandaged and sensitive hands and watching it roll across the infield to third base, let him realize he was going to recover, that he could persevere! *Unsung Heroes* is a heart-felt thank you to honor the men who rescued him and who gave him a second chance at life.

Those of us who know Joe thank him for sharing his very personal story. Joe and Sandy are long-time, hard-working supporters for many of Hillsboro's community activities, including the Hillsboro Community Library and the Hillsboro Historical Society. We have enjoyed their company, their friendship and their many years of faithful support.
