Featured This Month:

The Death of Bernadette Lefthand – A Murder Mystery by Ron Querry

Mystery surrounds the senseless death of a beautiful, spirited young Indian woman Through powerful magic, evil forces pervade the lives of those closest to Bernadette. Clues to her brutal murder unfold leading us to the heinous crime of Navajo Witchcraft. Author Ron Querry, a Member of the Choctaw Nation, holds a Ph.D from the University of New Mexico. He writes with unusual depth and power. This story imparts a fictional account of events and life ways that are rooted in fact and reflected in an absorbing mystery.

Recollections of a Western Ranchman by Wm. French Originally published in 1928, Captain William French writes a frontier memoir with balance, perception and droll British wit. This is the story of a landed Irish gentleman who happened to live through the wildest years of the New Mexico-Arizona border country. French displays a perceptive and balanced admiration for soldiers and Indians alike and has personal encounters with outlaws such as Black Jack and Butch Cassidy, with sometimes humorous results. Recommended by Eugene Manlove Rhodes as "the best Western book I have read".

New Mexico Odvssev by Toby Smith

Toby Smith, an award-winning journalist, goes on the road in New Mexico, to find memorable people and places resulting in unusual stories to share with the reader. Divided into four sections: Memories, Trails, Junctions and Mosaics, this small book gives us insight into the inherent, (and real) personality of New Mexico. The author presents subjects as diverse as Hurd's People, O'Keefe's Country, Home Sweet House and A Close Encounter! Informative and entertaining.
