Interpreter of Maladies by Jhumpa Lahiri

Interpreter of maladies is a Pulitzer Prize winning book of stories by Jhumpa Lahiri. This diverse set of tales is unified by the connection of most of the major characters to the culture of India. The stories take place in either the northeastern United States or in India

In "A Temporary Matter" a young couple's first child was stillborn. The story describes how they deal with the death and each other in the first few months after the event.

Mr. Pirzada is in America on a one-year sabbatical from Dacca where he has left his wife and daughters.


"When Mr. Pirzada Came to Dine," which he did frequently, the family and guest spend their time watching the news coverage of the fight of Bangladesh to become an independent nation.

Mr. Kapasi is an interpreter for medical patients-"Interpreter of maladies"--in India who gives guided tours of tourist sites on the weekends. The story is about his romantic imaginings centering on the wife of the family he is guiding and the eventual inevitable disillusionment.

Miranda is called "Sexy" by her married lover. When the young son of a friend in the middle of a divorce also calls her sexy, she asks him what it means.

Eliot spends many happy hours at "Mrs. Sen's" house in spite of his mother's reluctance to trust her to watch him after school. But Mrs. Sen has problems adapting to the demands of the society in which she finds herself.

"This Blessed House," is a phrase open to more than one interpretation.



The growing prosperity of her neighbors causes the downfall of Boori Ma, their substitute for "A Real Durwan."

In "The Treatment of Bibi Haldar" an Indian doctor proposes an unusual treatment for an intractable chronic disease.

The series of stories ends on an upbeat note in "The third and final continent." An old lady gives a recent immigrant and his wife in an arranged marriage a new perspective on their relationship.

The stories are well put together and the characters are well developed in spite of the shortness of each of the stories. The descriptions of India and its customs add an exotic flavor to a collection of well-told stories. I recommend it.
