History as Spoken

Not so long ago the Hillsboro Community Center sponsored a program on the collection of oral histories which garnered a great deal of interest among local residents, many of whom have fascinating tales of their lives and their community in past times. The value of such efforts can be appreciated in our featured book this month, a unique memoir of the Southwest.

Featured This Month:

Marietta Wetherill: Life with the Navajos in Chaco Canyon edited by Kathryn Gabriel

This book describes the everyday life and beliefs of the Diné as experienced by a woman who lived among them for many years. The story starts early in the life of Marietta with her recollections of trips that she took with her parents and siblings over a large portion of the western United States in the late nineteenth century. One of the objectives of these trips was to get to know the Indian tribes that inhabited the region. On one of these trips Marietta met her future husband, Richard Wetherill, who was an amateur archaeologist. When they married they moved to Chaco Canyon and started a trading post. They filed for homesteading on a large portion of the canyon with the stated purpose of protecting it from pillaging. During their stay there Marietta was the primary person who ran the trading post and interacted with the Diné on a day-to-day basis. She learned to speak Navajo and was adopted by one of their medicine men so she got to observe and participate in a large number of rituals that were closed to outsiders

The book is based on tapes of interviews of Marietta Wetherill by Lou Blachly, a newspaperman from Silver City. The interviews took place late in her life ending in 1953 shortly before her death. They cover a period from the mid 1880s to around 1910. The tapes



were transcribed by Mary Blumenthal at UNM in the early 1970s. The approximately one thousand pages of the transcript were edited and compiled by Kathryn Gabriel, a historian at UNM, to eliminate redundancies and placed in approximately chronological order. There are extensive footnotes mainly comparing her versions of stories to those recorded elsewhere, particularly in the biographies of her husband. They are located at the end of each chapter, which makes them less intrusive than the normal location at the bottom of the page.
